What's New

- The VaporPaper Utility programs were officially retired and replaced instead with a webserver built into VaporPaper.
- No software needs to be installed to run reports, just Internet Explorer and a login.
- “Live Views” show what is in the port window for the selected port and can refresh automatically as new data is received.

New Report Options

- Reports now include all data in the selected date range with text searches highlighted.
- Reports can now show previously hard to understand control characters that are especially common in automation protocols.

Remote Login

- When users access the VaporPaper remote server, they are presented with a standard browser authentication window.

Screen Status

- **The Status screen shows program information and the parameters for all the ports.**

Live View Search

- The Live View shows the data in the current port window on the collector. Auto-refresh can be selected so it refreshes automatically every minute.
- The “Only Display Most Recent Data” switch causes only the most recent lines to be displayed to save bandwidth.

Live View Report

- The “Live View” shows the data currently in the port window on the collector program. The auto-refresh can be enabled or disabled by setting the checkbox.
- Each port selected opens a new window so you can have multiple ports open simultaneously.

History Search

- The history report search screen allows search for strings or just by a date range (leave the search string blank). A popup calendar is available to make date entry easier.

History Report

- Each history report screen opens in a new window so you can run several reports and have them viewable at the same time. If you entered a search string, all occurrences of it in the date range are highlighted for you.

Access Levels

- In the VaporPaper Configuration program, the Remote Access tab allows you to enable/disable the remote access server, set it's port number and maintain usernames and passwords as well as rights to which functions they can perform.
